**Brian W. Dodd** enters his 11th year on the staff and 2nd year as Director of the All-Ohio State Fair Band. Previously, he served as Assistant Director in charge of Percussion. He received his Bachelor Degree in Music Education from The Ohio State University and is in his 33<sup>rd</sup> year as a music educator and 19<sup>th</sup> year as Director of Bands at West Holmes High School in Millersburg. Mr. Dodd currently directs 235 students in the schools two concert bands, as well as jazz, pep and marching bands and percussion ensemble. The ensembles are active year round having performed throughout Ohio, Pennsylvania, Washington D.C. and Florida while playing regularly for the Cleveland Cavaliers and the Annual Holiday Parade in Pittsburgh. He is a Certified Red Cross First Aid and CPR instructor, former National Honor Society Adviser, was OMEA District 10 Chairman. He hosts the district's Large Group Adjudicated Event and was awarded the OHSAA Sportsmanship, Ethics & Integrity Award. He is an active performer, is a member of the American Federation of Musicians Local #159, an Adjunct Music Faculty member at Mount Vernon Nazarene University and has had members in the AOSFB for 33 years! 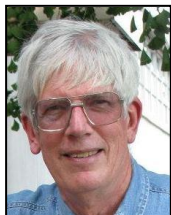
