Director

Brian W. Dodd enters his 11th year on the staff and 2nd year as Director of the All-Ohio State Fair Band. Previously, he served as Assistant Director in charge of Percussion. He received his Bachelor Degree in Music Education from The Ohio State University and is in his 32nd year as a music educator and 18th year as Director of Bands at West Holmes High School in Millersburg. Mr. Dodd currently directs 235 students in the schools two concert bands, as well as jazz, pep and marching bands and percussion ensemble. The ensembles are active year round having performed throughout Ohio, Pennsylvania, Washington D.C. and Florida while playing regularly for the Cleveland Cavaliers and the Annual Holiday Parade in Pittsburgh. He is the National Honor Society Adviser, was OMEA District 10 Chairman hosts the district's Large Group Adjudicated Event and was awarded the OHSAA Sportsmanship, Ethics & Integrity Award. He is an active performer, an Adjunct Music Faculty member at Mount Vernon Nazarene University and has had members in the AOSFB for 33 years! He and his wife Lori currently reside in Bladensburg Ohio.



Edward P. Gallagher (F Horn, '84-'87) is in his 30th year as a member staff and 2nd year serving as Director of Operations for both the AOSFB and All-Ohio State Fair Youth Choir. 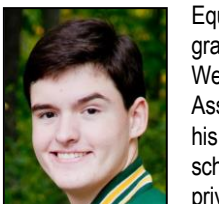

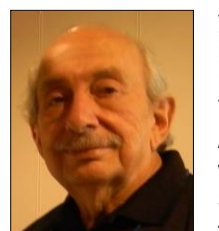
